

Years ago, the phrase "the art of life" awakened in us an imagination of life with Him. This art is practiced in the three most signi cant relationships that shape our lives. Paul writes to the church in Ephesus and invites them on a journey of relationship:

- With Him the One who created us (deeper);
- **With each other –** in the bond of unity through Christ's love (nearer);
- With our world dedicating ourselves to the good works He has prepared for us (further).

In the Mosaïek family, we embark on this journey together:


1. Mosaïek – the Afrikaans congregation that currently serves as

the base for all activities in the family. We meet each person where

they are, offering opportunities unique to each individual's journey.

2. Origins – our retreat space. Over the past year, 1,500 people have attended

retreats, and more people outside the Mosaiek family are showing interest. We dream of meeting people where they are and offering diverse retreat experiences for various phases of the faith journey.





3. eMosaic – our online presence, serving two key groups:
Digital natives – people who may never visit the physical congregation
but view online content as their primary spiritual nourishment. *Hybrids* –
individuals who frequently attend in person services and experiences but also find significant
value in online content. Online, we offer groups that meet virtually, interactive learning experiences,
and services at specific times. Currently, through KykNet, we serve a large audience online –
approximately 60,000 people on a Sunday and 40,000 through daily devotionals. We dream of
coordinating opportunities where the congregation can experience in-person connection as well.
4. Mosaic – As part of the family, this congregation will share the same ethos and philosophy as the
rest of the family. The team is being built, with Tarine de Ridder serving full-time on the leadership
team and Jose Crosson focusing primarily on worship and service experiences. We trust the Lord for
an additional leader for this team, as well as someone to focus on youth ministry.

To achieve this, we commit ourselves to the good works He is calling us to. Perhaps you feel moved to dedicate yourself to His good works – offering your time and energy to help build the Kingdom of God alongside the Mosaiek family. Pray about it – it could be one of the most significant growth experiences of your life.

Years ago, when we decided to build Mosaïek and when this community was established, the words of Galatians 2 were an anchor: "Never forget the poor." Our focus is to provide food to children and the elderly. Our goal is to provide about 20 000 meals per day and in 2024 we provided around 4.2 million meals to the needy.

One of the spaces where we can have a direct impact on the community is Emthonjeni in Zandspruit. Joyce, an elderly who is involved with some of the projects at Emthonjeni, shared her story.

"


Hi, my name is Joyce. I'm 58 years old. I've been living here in Zandspruit from 1999. I look after my sister's child.

We're living in a dif cult situation. We're suffering because my sister's child is a CP (Cerebral Palsy). She can't walk, she can't do anything. I'm taking her to the hospital. I put her on my back because there's no road. We're even struggling with the wheelchair.

It's how we live. I love her so much; we're supposed to love our children like this. The nice thing is, we also get love from Emthonjeni. They call us, we have meetings there. We share the problems and the struggles we have.

I'm so grateful for these projects and all the support .

Along with the millions of meals provided each year, we also took hands with partners to establish new congregations in informal settlements, as well as the training and development of leaders.











OPERATING INCOME






ALLOCATION OF EXPENSES
